Expectations

- Serve consistently and on time
- Come prepared
- Attend training events and meetings whenever possible
- As much as we encourage relationships among your team, once in the room with the kids they are your top priority

SAFETY & SECURITY

- Pick up tag for children : Preschool & Elementary
 - Please make sure parent has pick up tag even if you know them. Parents behind them need to see how important their child's safety is to us. But please remember "People over Polices".
- As FM Volunteer, it's essential that you always practice healthy boundaries with children...for their safety, and for yours. These guidelines exist to protect children from harm and to protect you from false allegations. Volunteers are expected to display the highest Christian values and morals in all formal and informal activities, behaviors, and conversations. And keep in mind, while these guidelines apply to your interactions with all children, they are INDISPUTABLE when dealing with children not of your gender.

And when serving, observe these guidelines <u>even with your own</u> <u>children</u> who may be in your care (other observers may not know that you are the parent, and we want to display excellence even in appearances).

Never be in a bathroom with a child alone.

- Volunteers can help a child use the bathroom only if the child is three
 (3) years or younger.
- <u>Female</u> (only) volunteers must be 16 years old and older to change diapers.
- Male volunteers can assist female volunteers if taking older children (elementary) to the bathroom (Volunteers cannot assist this age child in the bathroom alone).

If you need to have a private conversation with a student, have the conversation in a public place - not behind closed doors, or in a room or vehicle alone.

Tips to help you navigate through this guideline:

Meeting with a student. Don't set up one-on-one meetings with students without the knowledge and consent of their parents. Avoid initiating one-on-one meetings with students; instead, allow the student or the students' parents to be the initiators.

Transportation. Never transport a student anywhere alone. If a student needs a ride, don't agree to drive them if you and the student will be alone. Arrange to have another adult or students ride with you. If that's not possible, it's OK to say no.

Relationships with students. As an Oak Ridge Students Volunteer, you'll develop healthy relationships with your students that are structured as "Female Leaders with Female Students", "Male Leaders with Male Students."

Log electronic conversations. When you find yourself in a sensitive conversation with a student, keep in mind that words and intentions can be misconstrued - intentionally or unintentionally. Any time you are engaged in a serious conversation with a student, log your conversations (take screen shots, type up a Word document, save text messages and emails, as well as dates). This may seem excessive, but if you're ever falsely accused of misconduct from a student or parent, you'll be glad you did it.

CAMPUS LOCKDOWN/EVACUATIONS

If Family Ministry areas need to be secured, ORBC Security Team will ask FM volunteers to lock/shut classroom/venue doors. Once the doors are locked/shut, wait for further direction.
